
# **Year 6 England Trip**



## Reception

This week, the children have been showing off their writing skills by completing an independent piece of writing. Some children wrote a whole sentence with finger spaces and a full stop. They carefully considered what they wanted to write about the story, 'The Great Race' and used their Fred fingers to sound out words and found their sounds on the sound mat.



All the home learning you are doing at home is really supporting them with their phonic knowledge and writing, please keep this up. Your children are really starting to progress.

We have revisited shape this week and challenged the children to manipulate their cut-out shapes to make new shapes. Ask them what happens when you fold a square in half or how you make two triangles out of one rectangle?

The children have been learning a Chinese New Year poem that they will be performing in front of the whole school in two weeks' time. Please take time at home to practise this with them, working particularly on expression and their presentation voice. We want the Year Six's at the back of the hall to be able to hear them. The visuals help them remember the words.

#### Year 1

Another busy week in Year 1 has flown past!

In Literacy this week we have been making story boards for our text driver 'The Pirate Cruncher'. Our focus has been on learning new vocabulary and using this, along with finger spaces, capital letters and full stops in our writing. First, we read our story and discussed any words that were unfamiliar. The children then made vocabulary sheets for these words. On these sheets they had to write a definition of the word, use it in a sentence, write down some synonyms and then draw a picture that matches the word. We then re-read the story and picked out the 6 main points to draw on the story boards. The children then used their story boards to write a descriptive narrative of the story.

In Maths this week, we have continued our learning on numbers to 20. we have looked at how to write numbers both is digits and in words. We have also been comparing numbers to 20, using the vocabulary 'more than,' 'less that,' and 'equal to.' Children would benefit from consolidation with this at home.

In Topic we have been learning more about pirates. We have been researching the life of Phillipe Janvrin and his connection to Jersey.

#### Year 2

We have now finished our Beegu writing – the children produced some really entertaining recounts of her time on earth which were fantastic to read! We will be starting our new writing topic on animal fact files which coincides with our **trip to the Zoo**. We are still in need of parent helpers for this on **Wednesday 31st January (9.00am–13.30pm)**. If you are available and would like to support us, please let us know at your earliest convenience.

In maths we have begun division! This week we have learnt the difference between sharing and grouping using our cubes. This is a tricky concept but we are proud of the resilience the children have shown with tackling this. Please use Mathletics or TT Rockstars at home to support progress at home. In art we have made animal prints using different textures and materials – they will really brighten up our corridor and perfectly complement our animal's topic in Science.

## Year 3

We have had a very busy week in year 3!

We have taken the next step in our volcano animations by creating a storyboard from before to after Mount Vesuvius erupting. The children have started to prepare what each slide will need and what to include to capture the destruction Mount Vesuvius did to the city of Pompeii.

In maths we have started our new unit of division, and the children are starting to realise how important it is to learn and know their times tables (3s,4s and 8s) as this is really helping with the multiplication and division fact families.

This week in Science we have been looking at the characteristics of rocks by grouping them and then scientifically looking at which types of rocks there are such as Igneous, Sedimentary and Metamorphic. We have been sorting them into groups using Venn diagrams and deciding in groups which rock goes where, thinking about if they are smooth, course, colour or if they had a sharp or smooth edge.

In Geography we have been exploring and explaining the features of a volcano. We have been discussing the three types of volcanoes that are formed, can the children tell you the names of these?

Polite reminder: as the February half term holiday is approaching shortly, this will give the children and yourselves time think now and to choose one of the activities to complete from the Pick n Mix

homework sheet, or if your child would like to do something else about volcanoes that is not on the sheet but wants to have a go at creating or making something else then please do! If you need another sheet, please ask your child to ask their class teacher to send one home.

Thank you to the children that have already completed one of the activities, we look forward to sharing these in class soon.
