Head Teacher's Comments

As this round of our Parent Consultations come to a close this week, it's started me thinking about what the next opportunity to 'meet' with you might look like. Very optimistically, I hope that it will be face to face in school. However, there will be many positive learnings to be taken for schools from the whole Covid experience and how we run some meetings may well go 'on-line' permanently from now on.

That said, being in the same vicinity of others is really important to humans and coming together to be social can't be beaten...much better than a Zoom get-together. With this in mind, we have pressed 'go' on summer events that have been on hold for so long. Our **PTA SUMMER FAIR** will take place (all things being equal) on **SUNDAY 11th JULY.** More details will follow, but please do keep this day free for the whole d'Auvergne community to come together. In preparation for the Summer Fair we need **books for the book stall, bottles for the bottle stall and bric-a-brac, toys and games (must be in excellent condition). Maths No Problem:

You will be able to use this to discuss what Maths your child has learned today at school as well as cover areas they found tricky and see the various methods we use in school today. Mathletics:

So far this year the children of d'Auvergne have been awarded 1 279 certificates!!!

9 GOLD certificates

152 SILVER certificates

1 118 BRONZE certificates

163 of these certificates belong to children from 2AB! Well done 😊

Our average student has spent 7 hours 37 minutes online on Mathletics.

As a whole school we have been online and interacting with Mathletics for 2924 hours and 55 minutes..... WOW!!!!

22, 363 activities have been completed!

In order to acquire these certificates please read the following advice from Mathletics:

A certificate is awarded to a student once they have earned 1000 points in a single week. Only one certificate is awarded each week, to help encourage sustained study by the student. Points are awarded across Mathletics in a number of ways:

- 1 point per correct answer in Live Mathletics
- 2 points per correct answer within the student's bonus level of Live Mathletics

- 10 points per correct answer within individual Mathletics curriculum activities*
- 20 points per correct answer within a curriculum Are You Ready? or Topic Test*

*Within the Mathletics curriculum a maximum of 300 points can be earned per week from a single activity (600 points for Are You Ready? or Topic Tests). This is designed to encourage students to attempt a wide range of activities.

Certificates are awarded as follows:

Bronze Certificate – 1000 points earned in a week

Silver Certificate – 5 x bronze certificates

Gold Certificate – 4 x silver certificates (20 weeks of sustained effort!)

It is important here to note that this is **sustained effort**, theoretically a Gold certificate cannot be fast tracked. If 1000 points are not earned in a week and no bronze certificate is achieved the points earned roll on over to the overall total.

Certificates are printed on a Thursday, if children earn their points by the end of the week they will still receive a certificate but this will be the following week.

TTRockstars:

This week saw the beginning of 'Rock Down Relief UK' – this tournament has been created by TTRockstars themselves, in aid of Comic Relief's Red Nose Day, and will run until the 18th of March.

Sadly, we have dropped from the 12th school in Jersey to 13th!! Let's try our best to get up there to the top 10!

We have had the following participation from each year group over the past 7 days, with the top average playing time being 4 minutes 35 seconds!

Year 3 - 70%

Year 4 - 46%

Year 5 - 65%

Year 6 - 96%

Nursery

We are continuing with our Subitising this week, please play the game on the link below at home to help to consolidate what we have been learning at school this week.

This week we have settled back into the Nursery routine and have enjoyed some of the lovely weather we have been having.

In Maths this half term we will be focusing on the skill of 'Subitising', the skill of knowing a quantity without counting. (e.g. rolling a die and knowing that it lands on number 4 without counting all of the four dots). This skill is really important for children to develop their mental maths skills and will support their understanding of number as they move up the school.


Dice - Maths


