The School Day

In Reception class lessons start at 8:15 and finish at 14.30.

In Years 1–6 lessons start at 8:30 and finish at 14.45.

Children can arrive at school from 8:15.

During the day children have a morning break of 15 minutes and a lunch break of 1 hour.

Breakfast Club and After School Club

Breakfast Club – 7.30 – 8.15

After School Club – 15.00 – 17.00

At d'Auvergne we have a wide variety of clubs and activities, where pupils can develop their interests and passions. More information is provided on the website, including a list of the school clubs and their current cost.

School Year and Holidays

The school year is split into 3 terms: Autumn, Spring and Summer. We have six school holiday a year:

- two weeks at Christmas
- two weeks at Easter
- six weeks' summer break
- 3 one-week half-term breaks.

Non-Uniform Days

There will be some non-uniform days during the year. On these days your child may come to school in their home clothes rather than their school uniform. You will be informed about these by letter in advance.

Parents and Teachers Association (PTA)

All parents are welcome to become involved in the school PTA. The PTA is a group of parents, supported by the Headteacher who organise events throughout a year to raise money to support the school.

Important Meetings

Curriculum Evening

During this evening, you will have the opportunity to meet your child's class teacher and hear about the learning planned for the term.

Consultation Meetings

Once a term you will meet your child's teacher individually to discuss their progress at school.

Parent Involvement

Throughout the year there will be various opportunities for you to come and see your child's learning at school. You will be notified about these opportunities nearer the time.

School Reports

Three times a year, you will receive a written report outlining your child's progress.
