Year 5

We started the week planning and carrying out a Science experiment. Our key question was: 'What object will fall quickest due to less air resistance?' We compared objects, found out their mass and then devised an experiment ensuring it was a fair test. Ask your children if they can explain why a flat piece of A4 paper falls slower than a crumpled piece of A4 paper. See if they can use the words 'air resistance' and 'surface area'.

In Literacy, we have had great fun creating our own 'Gravity Rap' poems. As we have been learning about free verse poetry, the children could choose their own style/ structure of rap poem. We then performed them to the class and took on board feedback from peers before our final masterpiece performances! We have been so impressed with the creativity.

In Maths, we have looked at Roman Numerals and have been solving problems converting numbers. Where might you find Roman Numerals today?

Year 5

Year 6

This week, in Year 6, we have continued to navigate our way through Persuasive Writing - this is an incredibly complex writing genre with many areas to explore and master. We have looked specifically at the use of brackets for parenthesis and the use of advanced punctuation like colons and semi-colons. We are all continually trying to improve our handwriting and the progress is starting to show; well done to those children who are now confidently using pens!

We have begun to explore our new Science topic of Inheritance and Evolution; each class has spent some time looking at how palaeontologists use fossils to find clues about how animals that are now extinct lived in the past.

In Maths, the children are mastering their methods of division, this is proving to be quite difficult for many of the children to master, so Mrs Wheaton has placed a video, help sheet and some examples for you to practice at home over the weekend (these are available on Google Classroom). It would be of great benefit to all three classes for the children to have a go at this, invest some time and really secure their use of division before we look at more complicated areas of Maths.

On Thursday we were joined by PC Carter, who shared with the children the importance of e-safety both online on their phones and on laptops and other devices. She also shared <https://www.common sense media.org/> with the children and encouraged them to check the appropriateness and legal age requirement for apps and games they play. Most children were stunned to know that YouTube is actually an over 18s website - the staff were quite shocked to see that none of the children said they accessed KidsYouTube, but they were all using YouTube.com!

Also on Thursday, the children learned about Remembrance Day and the importance and history surrounding this tradition. They were all incredibly respectful during the minutes silence and made us very proud.

This week the achievers are Lily T(6A), Helier (6H) and Danny (6W).

What a transformation this girl is having! Well done Lily T!! You have been incredible this week! She has confidently approached a difficult Maths week with an 'I can!' attitude. Lily was able to guide me through a complicated 4 digit by 2-digit division problem with confidence and ease. Keep this up Lily! YOU CAN DO IT!!

This week, the achiever in 6H is Helier. He has been absolutely fantastic and increased his appetite for learning immensely. Helier is really pushing himself this half term, and every day is willing to knuckle down and work hard, even asking for extra work to complete! Well done, Helier - keep up the exceptional motivation for learning. Super proud teacher!

Danny is our achiever in 6W this week, for getting a gold certificate in Mathletics, which is helping him improve in his Maths. Danny is also a great team player and loves to help others and do jobs in class. Despite finding things difficult, Danny will always persevere and try his best. Well done, Danny – 'I can, I will, and I am going to!'

Next week we will be welcoming the wonderful Kirsten, from YOU MATTER, back for some workshops, with the focus on Friendships. She will be discussing the importance of friendships; how to maintain healthy friendships and what to do if you find yourself in an unhealthy friendship.

Homework:

Reading – continue to read your library books as well as anything else you can lay your hands on! Cracking comprehension tasks are set and should be completed weekly!

Spelling – 10 new spelling words have been set this week that use the suffix -ible. Can you read them, identify the sounds and special friends, note the syllables and use them in a sentence?

Maths – Google classroom division revision! Plus, the usual Mathletics and TTRockstars!

Talking homework – Research a fossil that catches your eye, send a photo to your teacher and be prepared to confidently speak about this fossil. Things to think about: Where is it from? Where was it found? How was it found? When was it found? What was it? What were its plus points? What were its disadvantages? How old is it? Is the animal around today? What is the closest relative the animal has today? Have many more of these fossils been found? Remember our talking time this term is to aim to talk for 2 minutes.
