Year Group Updates

Nursery

Another busy weekend in Nursery with plenty of mini-beast and insect hunting going on across the environment. We have been focusing on "keep trying ... again and again" based on our book Tilda Tries Again (Tom Percival). This level of perseverance is something that can be supported at home please - especially with selfcare and changing clothes.

Within our Key Group sessions, the children have been starting to recognise their own names or the first letters and sounds their names possess. They have also been counting toys and introducing the concepts of "I more or I less". Finally, we have been role playing what anger and sadness look like and what we can do if we spot this with our friends.

We have loved chatting to parents about how well our children have settled into Nursery life this week - and please don't panic - we will get a round to everyone. It really is shame that these conversations are bound to the telephone, but great to chat nevertheless.

Reception

This week we have assessed the children with their reading and sent home a learning slip explaining where your child is currently working at on our Read, Write, Inc programme. We

Group A children- Please focus on practicing those flash cards! The more fluent they are in knowing these sounds, the more ready they will be for blending/ reading words.

Group B Children- Continue to practice daily with flash cards. You should also receive blending books. Please practice these daily also.

Group C children- Continue to read the blending books and practice 'special friend' sounds.

All children- Please practice name recognition and writing at home. This is so important in developing your child's confidence and independence as well as writing.



Year 1

This week in Maths we have been looking at the way we record number sentences.

Please see the picture below as a way of explaining how to record number sentences and to help them understand that the total can sometimes go first!



We have linked our writing to our History topic this week, and have been looking at developing an awareness of the past and discussing changes within our living memory. The children have enjoyed thinking and writing about how they have changed since they were a baby. As scientists, we have been doing some investigations using the pinecones that you have kindly brought in. We made predictions about what would happen to a pinecone when it got wet and recorded our observations in a table. Please ask your children if they can describe the results to you!

In light of the recent rise in Covid-19 cases, we will continue to keep our windows and doors open throughout the winter to allow for lots of ventilation. Please ensure that as the weather gets colder, you send your child in wearing a vest under their t-shirts and a school jumper.

Year 2

This week in our writing lessons, we have been learning how to write a recount so that we can talk about our Jewish Wedding. The children can identify the key features that they need to write a recount and have consolidated their previous learning by trying to include expanded noun phrases. Can they recount the wedding to you at home?

In maths, we have been continuing addition and subtraction of two-digit numbers. We are still finding that children are struggling with basic mathematical concepts such as number bonds. Please reinforce this learning at home. You could do this by playing games such as 'hit the button' on Top Mark with them.

Year 3

This week, year 3 have begun reading their new class text, 'Bear Grylls Adventures-The Volcano Challenge.' The children are thoroughly enjoying this book and are already talking about what they think may happen in the remaining chapters. We are using our new class text to introduce to the children how to use speech marks to show when a character is speaking and thinking about alternative words to use instead of 'said'.

In maths, the children have been developing their column subtraction skills and have been learning how to use the column method with renaming. The children are getting on well understanding this new skill and this will be revisited later on in the year to ensure the skills is consolidated.
