#### **Head Teacher's Comments**

#### Online Safeguarding Concern: Omegle, Chatroulette, Kik

We are aware of concern from some parents about websites which enable children and young people to meet strangers online, with no moderation or age restriction.

The most common of these are Omegle, Chatroulette and Kik, and they can expose children to inappropriate and unmoderated content.

While these applications are blocked on the school network, children and young people can still access them via devices out of school

Parents can access information about how to talk to their child about internet safety <u>via NSPCC</u>. Information for children on what they can do if they see something upsetting is available <u>via BBC newsround</u>.

Information on how to block specific websites and adult content is available for <u>apple</u> <u>devices</u> and <u>android devices</u>.


#### Reception

What a week filled with glitter, sparkles, and excitement!

The children in Reception have been very creative this week and have been practising using

their fine motor skills with scissors and various writing tools. We are encouraging the children to have the correct pencil grip and use the little rhyme nip, flip, and grip to support them with holding a pencil in a tripod grip. Use the picture to support your child at home.

As Christmas is approaching, we have been reading the traditional Nativity story and have shared our own thoughts about how Mary and Joseph would have felt when Baby Jesus was born. Ask your children if they can retell the story with you at home.



In Maths, we have been sequencing events, so putting things in the right order. For example, getting dressed - First put on your t-shirt, then put on your jumper and finally, your warm coat. Perhaps you could try muddling this up at home and see if your child can help you do this in the right sequence.

#### Year 1

This week in maths we have been focusing on subtraction. We have been using the subtract by crossing out method. Using pictures, children have been counting the number of items and then crossing out the amount they have to take away to solve the subtraction problem.

In Literacy this week we have been writing letters to Father Christmas! This has been the focus of this terms unaided write. Children have thought about the structure of a letter, thought about questions they would like to ask Father Christmas and thought about what they would like for Christmas this year.
