Literacy

The children will be continuing with the Maths No Problem approach. Your child will need to know ALL times tables up to 12×12 by the end of the year, so encourage plenty of TT Rockstars time! Do not forget about Mathletics and Maths Tutor to support your learning.

Spring 1 Topic: Traders and Raiders

We will be teaching the following sections about everything Vikings.

- Plotting key events on a timeline.
- Finding our who Vikings were.
- Identifying and explaining aspects of Viking life.
- Using sources to debate the reputation of the Vikings.
- To explain why the Viking period came to an end.
- How did they influence Britain/Jersey?

Spring 2 Topic: Road Trip USA
We will be teaching the following sections about everything Road Trip USA.

- Locate USA on a map.
- What is the physical geography of USA?
- What is the USA?
- What are the biomes of USA?
- How does the USA compare to Jersey?

Spelling:

In the Spring Term, the children will be learning a pattern each week as well as a few 'Common Exception Words'. We will continue to write a list into the Homework Diaries each week. Please, help your child to practise these little and often

Reading:

Please ensure that your child is reading at least three times a week out loud at home. The more reading a child does has been shown to directly improve academic ability in all areas of their learning – therefore the more they read the better they do at school.
