Reception

As we reach the end of what has been a busy and productive half term, we want to take a moment to thank all of you for your support in helping the children settle into Reception. It's been truly wonderful to watch the children grow more confident with routines and expectations, and, of course, have fun each day. Super Smiles Initiative -This week, we launched our **Super Smiles** program, and we were excited to have Bernadette visit each class to show the children the proper technique for brushing their teeth. Thank you to everyone who returned the permission slips. After snack each day, the children will be brushing their teeth for 2 minutes, focusing on the correct brushing motion. Read Write Inc. – Sounds Assessment – We've also been busy assessing the children's phonics progress this week. After half term, we'll be starting our **Read Write Inc.** sessions. To help support this, we encourage you to keep practicing sounds with your child over the break. Try breaking down words into sounds while you're out and about—something like "time for b-e-d" or "look, a fluffy c-a-t"—it really helps reinforce their learning!

The children also had a go at their first independent write - writing their name and drawing a self portrait. Well done to all children for giving it a go and trying to form each letter correctly.

Just a quick reminder that **Library Day** is every Wednesday. Please remember to send your child's book bag so they can exchange their books and bring home a new one to enjoy together.

Year 1

This week in writing, the children have been busy recounting our trip to the Zoo. Before they started writing, the children had to edit Miss McEnery's 'writing' and they were not impressed! They had to add full stops, capital letters and finger spaces using their special purple pens. All of the children tried very hard with their writing, and it has been lovely to see their writing progress over this half term.

In Maths, we have been consolidating all of our prior learning in maths including number bonds, addition and part-part whole models. We started our first lesson of subtraction and spent some time going over anything that we were unsure of.

We spent some time painting this week making both 'Diwali' firework pictures, Mendhi patterns and painting some animals in topic. The children had to use different resources to make the animals skin. Some of them chose to use sequins for scales and feathers. They then had to describe their animal and group them into mammals, reptiles, fish, birds or amphibians.

We hope you have a lovely and restful half term and we look forward to welcoming the children back on Monday 3rd November.

Year 2

We have had a great week of learning in Year 2.

The children have finished writing their independent diary entries about The Great Fire of London. There has been some fantastic work produced with great use of adjectives, capital letters, full stops and exclamation marks. The children have also been working on rereading their work to check for any mistakes or missed punctuation and to correct this with a purple pen. We have also been looking at different types of word this week including

adjectives (describing words), nouns (naming words), verbs (doing words) and conjunctions (words that join sentences together or add more information to a sentence like 'and' 'because').

In maths we have been consolidating our learning of column addition. The children are becoming very familiar with this method of addition now and are becoming confident in using it to add 2-digit numbers together. We have also begun to look at subtraction using the column subtraction method. We have been working on subtracting a 1-digit number from a 2-digit number without crossing over the 10s. After half term we will be using column subtraction to subtract a 1-digit number from a 2-digit number where the answer will cross into the previous 10 and then move on to subtracting 2-digit numbers from 2-digit numbers. Children would benefit from consolidation of this at home.

Children have been enjoying their music lessons on Tuesday's and Thursdays. They have been learning different songs and musical instruments. The children would love to share their learning with you! We would like to invite Year 2 parents to come in and watch their children's musical performance on the afternoon of Tuesday 25th November. More information regarding specific times for each class will be sent out soon.

The children have been enjoying their computing lessons this week. They have been learning to code using the program 'Scratch'. The children were all able to create a program where they made their 'sprite' (little character) move around the screen, say something and then change to a new background.

PE days will be changing next half term. We have the fantastic opportunity to be taught some football skills by the Jersey Bulls. We will now be having PE on **Thursdays** with coach Rob and **Fridays** with Jersey Bulls.

We hope you all have a lovely half term break. Thank you for your continued support. Miss Aubert and Miss Crocker.

Year 3

What a wonderful first half term we have had with trips to the Opera House, our Jerriais experience and working with Mr Liveseybjn the Makerspace being particular highlights.

Firstly, we would like to thank all the families who came in for our arithmetic drop in on Wednesday and the ballet on Friday. We had wonderful feedback from Miss Helen and the dancers about how wonderful the children were to work with each week and how they conducted themselves whilst at the Opera House. We couldn't be prouder!

We have been blown away by how engaged the children have been with our Ancient Greeks topic, so we thought it would be nice for the children to provide children with Pick and Mix home learning. Year 5

We have continued reading our book, The Secret of Platform 13, and the children have been answering a range of questions on what they have read. We will continue reading this for the rest of the Autumn term. In Science, the children have been busy creating fact files for both Marine Iguanas and their creatures they have created, which have adapted to live in a desert or arctic environment. We had our first YouMatter session this week on the topic of 'Body Image'. The children showed great maturity and engagement throughout this session.
